

Dream in Stripes and Dots All November Long

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Fogo Island Inn thinks it's dreamy that [Fogo Island Shop](#) has partnered with Toronto-based designer Jeremy Laing and Canadian-born, Paris-based, [Fogo Island Arts](#) alumnus Zin Taylor, to produce a limited run of unisex pyjamas. To mark this collaboration, there will be a month-long celebration of comfort and craft at the Inn: the two-night **Pyjama Time Sleepaway** Itinerary will feature all meals, excursions, a designer's reception and special bedtime readings. This itinerary runs **November 1 through to November 30, 2016**.

A Fogo Island year consists of Seven Seasons, and Fogo Islanders know the month of November as Late Fall Season. With winter's first frost nipping, Late Fall is a wonderful time for relaxing while sipping warm beverages in your pyjamas as the North Atlantic torments the 420-million-year-old rocks on the other side of your floor to ceiling windows.

Wild and wonderful November gales create the backdrop to land-based tours that visit boat-building sheds, furniture workshops and the island's artisan Guild. There will be plenty of opportunities to meet and talk with the people of the island practicing crafts passed on through generations. Guests can also enjoy activities such as seabird and caribou watching, bonfire nights and invigorating hikes. Back at the Inn, where all meals are included, the rooftop hot tub and saunas provide warmth and relaxation under starry skies. During the **Pyjama Time Sleepaway**, guests will be invited to slow their pace and indulge in extra PJ lounging time.

This November only, Jeremy Laing and Zin Taylor's limited run of unisex pyjamas will be made available to in-house guests at two-for-one friends-and-family pricing. The entire Stripes and Dots line is made of 100% cotton and is inspired by Zin Taylor's project, *The Story of Stripes and Dots*, which features works Taylor created during a residency with Fogo Island Arts. Taylor conceives his sculptural components—stripes and dots in many variations—as words in a sentence, the articulation of which can be ongoing. Canadian designer and maker Jeremy Laing continues Taylor's narrative, adding his own ideas about a stripe and a dot and how they connect with his design vision. The result blurs the lines between night and day, art and fashion, statement and silence.

The itinerary includes: two-for-one pricing on the unisex herringbone-weave cotton pyjamas, hand-blocked and hand-stitched on Fogo Island; Taylor's Fogo Island Gallery exhibition catalogue, *The Story of Stripes and Dots*; all meals in our award-winning Dining Room; use of the Inn's heritage library, private cinema, rooftop sauna and hot tubs and other facilities. The two-night-minimum itinerary begins at \$1,575 per night, exclusive of taxes, and is based on two persons sharing. Solo travellers deduct \$200 from the base rate. Family suites are available.

Sample Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive on Fogo Island and explore the shoreline adjacent to the Fogo Island Inn. Dine in the oceanfront dining room and watch the sun gently set over the ocean through floor-to-ceiling windows on three sides. After supper, head to the roof to relax in the hot tubs and sauna. Pause for some stargazing before returning to your room to cocoon in your pyjamas.

Day 2: During the month of November, you are welcome to come down for breakfast in your pyjamas, enjoying the Inn as a veritable home away from home. On your first full day on Fogo Island, you can take advantage of the Inn's community host program. Spend time with your

community host before catching an afternoon workshop: quilting, boatbuilding, and art workshops are all available in Late Fall. Return to Fogo Island Inn for a designer's reception to toast the PJs and speak about the design process. After supper enjoy an evening of local music in the lounge, take in a film (with traditional movie snacks) in our in-house cinema; or relax in your suite, cozy as you listen to the crashing of Atlantic waves outside.

Day 3: Guests departing Fogo Island will have breakfast in the dining room, before leaving for the ferry. If you remain longer on Fogo Island, you can fill the rest of your time with excursions and activities, including: hiking, bicycling, exploring, workshops, visiting the artist studios, taking an architecture tour, or again simply lounging in your pyjamas in the tranquility of your suite.

Access to Fogo Island, Newfoundland, Canada:

Gander, Newfoundland is the international gateway to Fogo Island. Commercial flights from Toronto with connections in St. John's or Halifax can bring travelers to Gander in just over four hours. The Inn offers a land-and-ferry house-car pick up and return service to Gander for \$800 (1-4 person capacity). Travel from Gander to Fogo Island takes two hours by car or

around 30 minutes by charter plane or helicopter. All transfer logistics and accommodations can be arranged by the Inn's reservations team at: 855.268.9277
